


JUNE NEWSLETTER

Dear Parents,

Alhamdulillah, we reached the end of the year while enjoying the blessed month of Ramadan. May Allah accept your fasting and prayers.

In math, we just wrapped up the probability unit. Probability is the likelihood or the chance that something will happen. We made predictions about outcomes of games and experiments, trying them out, and then checking the results. Students learned to use what they have observed to help make predictions about what might happen if they tried the same activity again. Finally, today we started the last chapter. We will be learning about patterns in geometry that involves flips, slides and turns. They will also be learning about patterns that use these movements. The goal for your child will be to identify and perform a variety of patterns involving 2-D geometric shapes and their movements.



In English, we started studying a second novel called The Canada Geese Quilt. It is a short novel but includes lots of new words that students could start using in their writing. It also helps students answer short questions by making inferences and analysing the text.



Students did a great job in presenting their Social Studies project. Lots of facts were collected about Ontario and students were happy to share and listen to these facts. Now, we are learning about aboriginal people and comparing their culture to ours.

In Science, we are starting our last unit about Earth and Space Systems. Students in this unit will learn about soil and identify the different types of soil. They will understand that soil is an essential source of life and it provides nutrients for many living things. Students will also learn that soil not only provides food and water for plants, but it can also be used by humans to make things. When exploring the importance of soil, students will also study the process of composting and learn how to prevent soil erosion.
